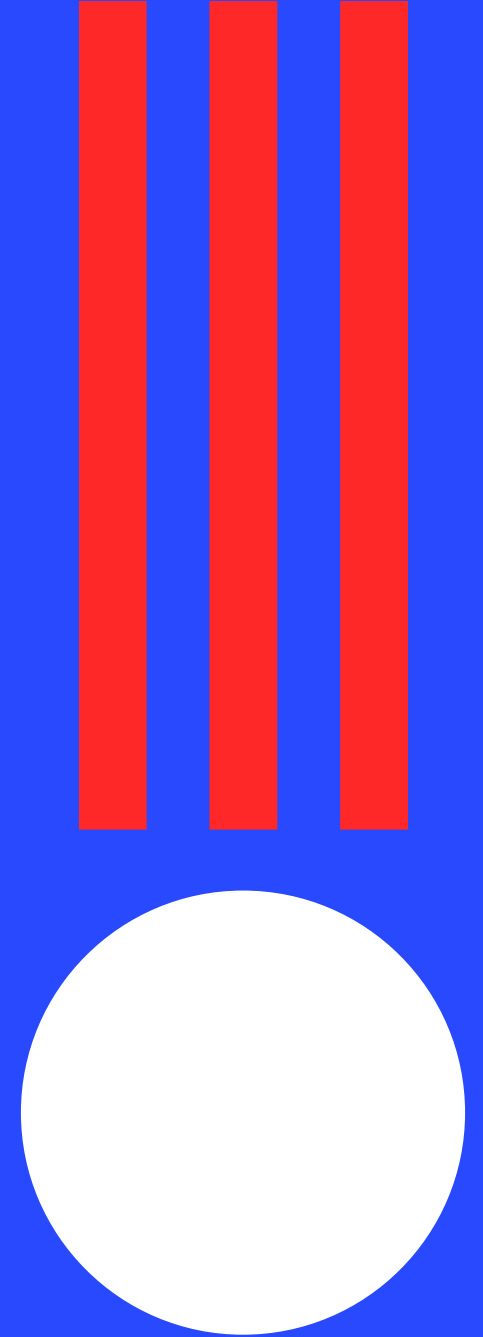




When Things Get Cancelled at the last minute...

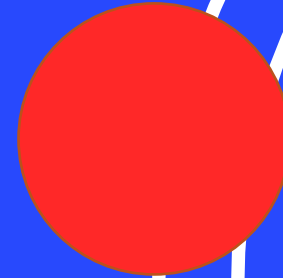

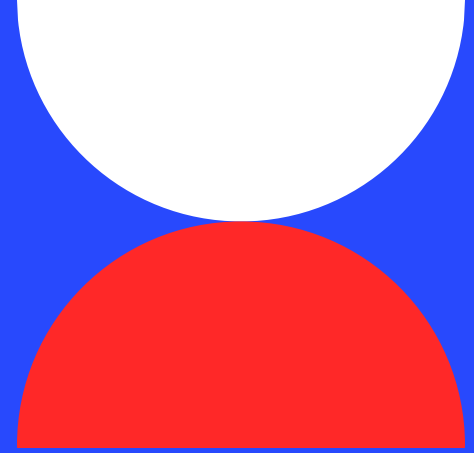


Did you check with “so in so” about “the” Calendar of Events?

Effective Methods to Ensure Safety when the Event FINALLY Happens...



Clear Understanding from all “Handlers” of Placement at the Event

- Traffic Flow
- Signage
- Plenty of space in between stations

Have staff on site that are trained in safe / correct packing of items other than Haz Materials

- Avoids personal injuries
- Avoids handling two – three times before recycler or disposer comes to transport from your facility
- Avoids potential fire hazards from battery exposure
